

St. Patrick's Church

Ballyshannon, County Donegal, Ireland (2002)

BACKGROUND

Ballyshannon located in the County Donegal is the oldest city in Ireland and home to St. Patrick's Church. The church was built in 1795; its age and battle with the area's year-round damp weather was showing its wear. The church was in need of significant restoration to bring it to its former glory.

SOLUTION

Kryton's restoration products were selected to refurbish this historic church.

After a thorough cleaning, Hydrostop Sealer was applied to the outside stone to provide a water repellent effect.
